Times for receiving are 10am to 12 noon on both days. Entry fee is \$20 per entry with a maximum of 2 entries per artist. An award ceremony will be held Friday, May 19, 2023, from 5 to 7pm. Cash Prizes will be awarded to First, Second and Third place winners. RAL retains 30% of any sales based on the price set by the artist. Proceeds support both Bay Transit and the RAL Art Center.
