Announcing... The 62nd Labor Day Art Show Winners!

A special reception for the artists and an awards ceremony was held on Friday, September 1 from 3 to 5 p.m. to kick off the celebration of the 62nd Labor Day Art Show (LDAS). The RAL Art Center's executive director, Sharon Stone, and LDAS committee co-chair, Juli Schuszler, gave a visual presentation at the ceremony. **This year's judge, James Warwick Jones**, an award-winning painter, art instructor, and former director of the Charles H. Taylor Art Center, presented his comments during the award presentation.

For the **Best in Show Award**, James Warwick Jones chose *What Was in that Pot?* a mixed media artwork by **Laurie Breakwell**. James said that it is "a wonderfully whimsical, creative expression of an interesting psychedelic idea." For the **Lella Lee Edwards Memorial Award for Excellence Overall**, Warwick chose *Let There Be Light*, a pastel by **Mel Neale**. James said, "We feel the personality of the artist in this beautifully drawn piece. It is excellent."

Holiday Shop 2023: Important Change for Vendors!

As you read in the August ArtLine, we are requiring that all Holiday Shop vendors limit their pricing to 12 tiers or categories. This is not a limit on the number of items that any vendor can sell – only of the price points.



Also, instead of simply showing up to set out their

displays on receiving day, all vendors MUST submit their inventory form in advance. Find the form online at Holiday Shop | RAL Art Center or come in for a printed form. The deadline for form submission to Charles Breakwell, assistantdirector@ralartcenter.com, is Tuesday, November 14, 2023. The main goal of this process is to eliminate any manual entry of items or prices. If everything can be scanned, the checkout time will be much, much shorter. Vendors who have not submitted an inventory form will not be permitted to participate in the Holiday Shop. Please get the word out to anyone you know who might be planning to sell at RAL this year. RAL Art Center Photography Group



Plant to Painting: Making Paper, Pigments, and Paint to Create Your Masterpiece Instructor: Celeste Johnson, botanical artist Dates: October 4, 11, & 18 Time: 10 am - 12:30 pm Cost: Members: \$35/class or 3 for \$100; Non-members: \$40 or 3 for \$115

An exciting new opportunity to make your own masterpiece from scratch. This set of three workshops will allow you to make your own paper from plants, your own pigments, and paint from natural materials and put them all together in a painting.

- Class 1 Natural Paper Making create your own paper from plants and other natural fibers. You will use a blender to create a pulp that will be strained and managed to dry into paper.
- Class 2 Pigment and Paint making while your paper is drying, you will use rocks, dried plants, stones, and other natural materials to make pigments. These pigments will then be turned into a paint medium of your choice.
- Class 3 Painting it all Together in this class, you will use your paper and paint to create your natural masterpiece. You can paint a flower or plant used in the ingredients of your paper or paint or bring a reference of your choosing.

Supplies will be provided by the instructor but feel free to bring any of your favorite dried plants, stones, or other materials to add to the mix.

Portraits Front-to-Back

Instructor: Cate Kauffman Dates: Four Sundays - October 8 through 29 Time: 10 am - 3 pm Cost: \$360 for members, \$414 for nonmembers

The ability to paint a portrait has been the bailiwick of artists for centuries. Whether it is creating a family heirloom or working to develop your drawing and painting skills, learning to complete a portrait is incredibly rewarding. It can take years to master this genre, but it is considered one of the critical skills all artists should have at least a basic understanding of how to complete.



In this workshop, you will work from your own reference photo and learn to develop an accurate likeness of your subject in charcoal working out the appropriate size and composition. You will learn how to transfer your drawing to your painting surface and then in either dry pastels or oils bring your painting into a full-color completed work. The instructor will provide the materials for the initial two sessions and will provide a supply list based on your choice of medium for the two painting sessions.

Participants should bring a clear photo at least 8x10 in size or larger of their subject. It is recommended that there be only one person in the photo. A self-portrait is also a possibility, and we can take and print an appropriate photo on the first day of class. Class size is limited to six students to allow for adequate attention to each.



Abstracting the Landscape of My Mind: Oil and Cold Wax Workshop



Meet this Month's Window Artists...

This month we are very happy to present the work of three talented RAL Co-op Artists: Ellen Huddy, Brenda Sylvia, and Jacquie Colligan Our first window artist during October is **Ellen Huddy**. She says, "*With the exception of two semesters of drawing studio in college I had no formal education in art. After joining the RAL I began taking some beginner watercolor classes and progressed through different levels with various instructors over several years. I have greatly enjoyed and benefited from these workshops and have also enjoyed getting to know and being inspired by the many talented artists that I've met here. The beauty of the rural countryside and the Chesapeake Bay waters are often my inspiration. Each painting I do represents a moment or an experience in my life, often working from photos or composites of photos. I strive to capture the light and the mood that may define the photo or the memory. Although these moments are unique to me, they are not uncommon experiences, and it is my hope that the viewer may also identify with that moment and appreciate what it may mean to them.*"

Brenda Sylvia is the second artist featured in our front windows. She says, "*The act of painting outside and experiencing nature firsthand is an integral part of my work. I am energized by the dynamic beauty of nature and through painting en plein air, I strengthen my connection to a specific place. In 2017, I moved back to Virginia after living and painting in the US Virgin Islands for nine years. Living in the tropics influenced my artwork in many ways. Now I am even more obsessed with color! Natural beauty has always been important to my artwork and my life. Here in the Northern Neck of Virginia, I am once again surrounded by inspiring landscapes which are my favorite subject. I strive to create a sense of place in my art. I want the viewer to 'see and feel' what I do in the subjects I choose to paint. My paintings here capture the beauty of rural life by the Chesapeake Bay."*

Rounding out the three windows artists is jewelry designer, **Jacquie Colligan**. Her avant-garde style has been inspired through study as well as by her visits to mineral-rich regions, such as Montana. This month, look for her work using Montana Agate in pendants and other beautiful pieces.
