Waiting in the Wings Selected for The Art Experience

<u>Cate Kauffman</u> was honored to have one of her paintings, "Waiting in the Wings" selected for The Art Experience at the Virginia Executive Mansion year-long show for 2023-24.

"Waiting In the Wings" is a 16x20" painting that Kauffman completed in December of 2019 and was shown at Art Speaks at the Bay School, RAL Art Center, and the Tappahannock Art Gallery over the intervening years.

In the meantime, a new governor was elected and the Youngkin family moved into the Executive Mansion. Governor Youngkin explained that traditionally most of the paintings on the walls of the small mansion where the Governor and his family lived during his term, were of "dusty old men in dark colors and old costumes." Most of them were paintings of significant historic figures and past governors. Since the family uses the first floor from time to time and it is also available for tours by dignitaries and tourists and other visitors, Mrs. Youngkin wanted to enliven the atmosphere of the building.

According to <u>The Art Experience</u> website, she worked with a team of curators from a variety of Virginia institutions to develop the plan for The Art Experience. It is now in its second year. The first installment of the Art Experience at the Executive Mansion nearly doubled the number of works of art from 26 pieces to over 48 pieces of hanging art, sculpture, and artifacts. Expanding on the initial exhibit, "Do What You Love in Virginia" boasts over 75 works from 37 institutions and independent artists. The Art Experience will continue to grow, with more pieces slated for installation in the coming months.

The Mansion's Art Experience has quadrupled the percentage of artwork and artifacts that celebrate minority subjects, Virginians, and culture. Virtually all the pieces were created by a Virginian, someone who was born in Virginia, lived in Virginia, studied in Virginia, or donated by a Virginian.

Kauffman reports that last summer a couple visited the RAL Art Center one Saturday and asked a lot of questions about the artists and the work there. When asked if they were looking for a particular piece, they advised that they wanted something by a local artist who did figurative work. Kauffman provided them with the business cards of several RALAC Co-op Artists and told the couple a little bit about each one. In August she was greatly surprised to get an email followed by a phone call: "Waiting in the Wings" had been chosen.

"You never know who will be visiting RAL Art Center," Kauffman says. "It's a great opportunity to market your work and share your talents."

While "Waiting in the Wings" is still available for sale, Kauffman reports she is pleased with its provenance and the many positive comments she has received about this piece. Should it ever sell, she says her granddaughter will receive a very special donation to her college fund and if it never sells, she will receive it as a gift.

The RAL Art Center's assistant director, Charles Breakwell, presented awards for the Photography Show on behalf of the judge, Steve Kancianic, at a First Friday reception on Dec. 1 at the RAL Art Center. The members artist show is on display on mobile display units. The show included 34 original photographs. It was not juried but it was judged by local photographer and owner of Yours Truly Studio, Steve Kancianic.

Steve awarded First Place to "Survival of the Fittest" by Harold Burnley, commenting on its beautiful composition, sharpness, and how it is evenly lit. Second Place went to "Live Oak-Brook Green Garden, S.C." by CarolAnne Taylor. Steve noted that the photograph has a beautiful composition and good detail. Third Place was awarded to "Copper Mountain" by Jeff Barsky because of its "beautiful color" and the fact that it "feels like I am there." He also appreciated the super sharp quality of the photograph.

Steve awarded Honorable Mentions to two photographs by Annie Barsky, "Wet All Over," and "After the Rain," and to Carolyn Flowers's photograph, "Sea Fog at Daybreak." Two photographs by Tom Martin, "Red Bucket" and "Let's Beach" received Honorable Mentions as did Bob Sutherland's "Veil in the Heavens."


